# How to determine your ring size 

## Confirm printed paper size

1. Ring measurements are very precise.

Carefully follow these instructions to obtain an accurate measurement.

2. Prior to printing:

On Windows: Press CTRL + P, set page scaling to None and print.
On Mac: Press Command + P, set page scaling to $100 \%$ and print.
3. Measure the bar on the right. It must be exactly 2 inches or 50 mm long.

## Measure current ring

1. Select a ring that properly fits the intended finger. Engagement and wedding rings are traditionally worn on the third finger (next to the little finger) of the left hand.
2. You can also use a ring worn only on the ring finger on the right hand. If this is the case, please let us know as we may need to adjust the size slightly.
3. Place the ring over the circles below. Match the inside edge of the ring to the circle nearest in size. This measurement refers to the inside diameter of the ring. If the ring falls between two sizes, order a larger size.
4. "If your ring design is resizable and you don't manage to get the ring size
 exactly right, our complimentary resize will allow you to size up or down up to 2 full UK sizes or up or down up to 1 full US size.
